New Ark Opening Times

Term Time - Monday to Friday

Preschool Playgroup 09:00-12:00 12:30-15:00

Eco Centre 09:00-12:30

Our children that attend New Ark playgroup learn through play using the adventure playground, farm and Eco centre. Pre-school children use the Eco centre as part of their full days in preparation for going to school. In the summer term we offer eco sessions for children due to start pre-school in the September.

Play Support Service 09:00 - 15:00

In our play support service we offer specialist support for individuals and small groups with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties. With our support more children can be helped with the transition back into a school setting.

Parent and Toddler Group 13:00 - 15:00

Our parent and toddler group are weekly sessions for children aged 0-4 years, giving them the time to explore our eco centre and city farm with their family.

Farm (Open All Year) 10:00-12:00 15:45-17:30

During session time the children get the opportunity to visit our city farm and to help to care for all of the animals that we have. That includes grooming and feeding them all. We also welcome group visits during term time and visitors during school holidays.

Playground 15:45-18:00 Term Time

8:30 - 17:30 School Holiday

During term time our afterschool playground, during term time, is all about adventure play with activities such as digging, building, ball games, swinging and climbing; and other activities based around a range of creative arts and crafts. The children also have the opportunity to visit the farm.

During the school holidays our playground activities are very similar to term time and the children also get the opportunity to do baking in our kitchen, outdoor cooking, den building, water slides, messy play and more. By prior arrangement we can offer childcare between 8.30am-5.30pm pm. During summer holidays we run eco forest school sessions for under 8s.

Introduction to New Ark Play

New Ark is a special place where children of all ages are encouraged to play in ways that are creative, adventurous and explore the world

We are an independent charity, officially called New Ark Play Association. We aim to provide stimulating play opportunities for all children, no matter what their age and background. Our facilities include a traditional adventure playground, an eco garden and a city farm.

We are run by a Management Council of local volunteers from different connections to New Ark who all have unique skills to New Ark.


We employ professional play and childcare workers, several of whom are Forest School trained. About 100 volunteers help with all kinds of jobs in the adventure playground, eco centre and city farm, plus admin and fundraising.

We are registered with Ofsted and were rated "outstanding" in our last two inspections, the last inspection was in May 2013.

We keep charges as low as possible and try to ensure that lack of money does not prevent children from enjoying our facilities. We are partially grant-aided by Peterborough City Council. We are also supported by grants, fundraising events and appeals.

Outdoor facilities At New Ark

At New Ark children can enjoy all kinds of play safely, under adult supervision, indoors and out, all year round. Our outdoor facilities include;

Adventure Playground

Many of the structures in our traditional adventure playground are handmade on site, using traditional building materials and discarded industrial parts. Children can ride our aerial runway, swing on a tyre, and play tag on our huge American swing. Alternatively, they can climb frames, roll down our hill, or join a den-building team.





Playground-goers explore risk in a controlled environment, while supervised by professional play workers, who know when to help and encourage, and when to step back to let children work things out for themselves. They get heaps of exercise, fresh air, contact with the natural world and all the benefits of play!

City Farm

New Ark is the only City Farm in the Eastern Counties. Children can see, touch and help to care for small pets, poultry and some larger farm animals. They learn about nature and enjoy the responsibility of caring for animals. Many of our animals were rescued from owners who could no longer care for them, and we try to rehome some of them.

We receive no Government funding and rely heavily on donations to help us pay for food, bedding and veterinary care. We encourage families to sponsor an animal and/or volunteer for animal care duties outside of our normal opening hours.





Eco Centre

With its woodland area, sensory garden and small orchard, children can observe the life cycles of wild creatures. They also learn to appreciate the colours, shapes and scents of plants. The area contains purpose-built natural play structures, which are generally suitable for younger children. In the Eco Centre the children are able to experience all of the natural elements of earth, air, fire and water.

During term time we run a weekly toddler group in the eco centre, and playgroup children attend a session every week. Sessions for older children are offered in school holidays.







Toddler Group at New Ark Eco Centre

Every Wednesday afternoon between 1pm to 3pm in term time pre-school children and their parents/ guardians come to play in our Eco Centre and Garden as well as to visit the Farm and meet the animals.

This is a very sociable group where parents can chat, share their experiences and support one another as their children play and explore the forest. It is great to watch the children grow from Babies to Toddlers, learning to love nature and 'the great outdoors'. Numbers vary from week to week with families coming from as far away as Ramsey, Market Deeping, Yaxley, Orton and Helpston to visit us and you can always be assured of a friendly welcome.

Toddler group is a good preparation for transition into New Ark Playgroup, encourages families to come along to play with their children and put their names on the waiting list for Playgroup.

Now that you have seen a summary of ways that we have funded New Ark over the last financial year, here is a more detailed description of a few of the different events that took place!

In April 2015 we organised an **Easter Egg Hunt** and invited along family and friends of the children that regularly visit us. We managed to raise £1,000 through people taking part in the egg hunt and stalls that we had on the day which included tombola stall and a raffle.





In June 2015 New Ark's midsummer festival was a very successful day and with help from staff, friends and families we managed to raise a staggering £1334. We had a number of differ-

ent activities going on during the day that included bouncy castles, cake stalls, a lucky dip, a raffle, treasure hunt, a speed football cage and plenty more.

After being a volunteer with us at New Ark for 9 months,

Natalia Marcfeld and her friend Harriet George took part in the Perkins Great Eastern Run around Peterborough during the month of October 2015 all in aid of raising money for New Ark. Natalia knew from volunteering here how much work gets put into fundraising events so gave us a helping



hand and managed to raise an amazing amount of £131.25.

Another little event that took place during October '15 was our **open day**, We have the building, adventure playground, city farm and eco garden available to the public, families and friends so that we can raise interest about New Ark, what we are about and what we do.

During November 2015, New Ark had our annual event which was the **Christmas Bazaar**. It is always such a good day for everyone that is involved and who visits us on the day. The children get the opportunity to visit Santa and get a present each. Other activities were face painting, refreshment stalls and plenty of arts and crafts. On this day visitors helped to raise £1350.



In December 2015 all of the children that attend our playgroup sessions, throughout the weeks of the year, were given the opportunity to take part in our **Pyjama Day**. They were asked to make a small donation and in the end together they raised £60.54.

Long term volunteer, Donne Buck, had previously set up the **Little House Money Collection Box Appeal** to get the children actively taking part in helping to raise money. The children get to make and decorate



a little money box that they take home with them and fill it with loose change. Once the boxes are returned they are also put into a com-

petition with a chance of winning a prize for the best decorated house. In January 2016 of this year, this appeal helped us to raise £52.96.

In February 2016, New Ark held a Pamper Evening

in the executive suite at the POSH Football Grounds. Included in the evening was stalls with indulgence products to chocolate stalls. From the



money raised through the supporters and volunteers of the evening we raised £561.02

New Playground Equipment

Throughout the financial year of 2015-2016 a number of different individuals/organisations have helped to raise funds for new playground equipment for all of the children that attend New Ark.

- **Bowmer and Kirkland** As contractors of **Waitrose**, who have helped us in the past, made a generous donation towards building the new playground.


So far this has raised £4511.00 and we intend to start the installation of the new playground in early 2017.



Financial Summary 2015-2016

The financial year ended in a deficit of £6.8k but we knew that this was what it was going to be as it has been a tough year with rising costs and social factors affecting us.

We have already started making changes in January this year with having to increase our prices in after school and school holiday club and also being more cost effective across the organisation.

Due to working time constraints we have been unable to write bids to apply for any grant funding, other than from Peterborough City Council, during this financial year. For New Ark to move out of the deficit, managers and trustees should continue to engage in applications to support the work we are doing.

With a healthy reserve balance we had decided to use some of this money to market our after school and school holiday club on wider scale to bring more people in, this should help to bridge the gap going forward.

Planning Ahead for 2016-2017

After ending in a fairly positive financial position, looking at New Ark as a whole we now need to focus on adapting to external influences to continue to meet the needs of the community. We are a hidden gem, so we are now looking at promoting what we provide to a wider audience through marketing and social media.

We have already scheduled to start advertising in 'Term Times' school publication which goes out to homes around Peterborough and surrounding areas. We have also started advertising in the Dogsthorpe Focus newsletter, which goes to 4,000 local homes. We are going to review how well this advertising works for us in the near future. We feel that this is a positive step as New Ark has never really advertised its services through printed media. There are many opportunities that with thought we think that we are missing out on. We are hoping that this is going to be a good year for us in marketing. This will be both challenging and exciting, with a potential of raising the profile as a charity and awareness of New Ark, not only as a child care provider, but also as an invaluable resource within the community and the business sectors.

We have also identified the need for an electronic accounting system so that we have better control of our finances on a day to day basis and also enabling parents to pay directly for the services that they use. We aim for the new account system to be up and running by April 2017.

The key to New Ark's future success is to look at obtaining more funding for all areas of the business. This will reduce overheads and open up new opportunities.

We have just had two new members join our committee, Natalia Marcfeld and Karen Maycock whose skills will help

During this next year we are looking for more parents/volunteers to get involved with the running of New Ark, for example helping at fundraising events, back office or joining the committee and this could be as little as committing just one hour a week.

The year ahead will hold many challenges with increased costs such as utility bills and salaries including pensions which are beyond our control but with the support of our community partners and volunteers if we can reduce other costs this will counteract the increase in overheads.

Thank you..to our community partners



Over the last year volunteers from Cummins have continued to work on some repairs and maintenance projects alongside New Ark staff ensuring grounds and facilities are in good safe working order for the children, visitors and staff to use.

Here are some of the tasks that they have been involved in.

- General tidy up in the bird enclosure on the farm area by laying new gravel and more recently they have removed old chicken sheds and built new ones
- Painted inside eco building and replaced the flower beds for children and staff to plant and grow new flowers
- Re-constructed the fence around the sandpit, near the playground, and also put the canopy up to cover the sandpit
- Painted outside of main building
- Helped out with human resource work
- Painted the kitchen and toilets inside the support service building
- Donated and delivered nearly new office furniture and removed the old
- Renovated the area runway by painting the structure and raking the sand
- Helped to build concrete bases and the new toy sheds for the storing the playgroup outdoor toys

In the spring of 2015, New Ark were privileged to be nominated by customers of Sainsbury's, Oxney Road store, to be their charity community partner or the year 2015 to 2016.

Sainsbury's staff helped to raise money through a number of different events which took place in the store. They had a staff bake sale, quiz night and they also had a number of collection boxes at each of their tills within the store.

New Ark volunteers also went along to attend corporate weekends in store and fundraised alongside staff in fancy dress costumes.

With the new law of the charge of 5p per bag that was brought within the year of fundraising for New Ark, being Sainsbury's community partners, the money that was raised through the sales of the bags was added to the amount donated to New Ark.

Beyond the fundraising, Sainsbury's staff volunteered a numerous amount of times to help with tasks such as; gardening and tidying the grounds prior to the New Ark's Open Day in October. Also the customer service's advisor, Emma Jefferson, attended a playgroup session to read to the children. New Ark was donated the unsold Halloween costumes, continually donated food items for the children's snack time, donated Easter Eggs which were then in turn given to the pre school children and the leftover ones were used on the Easter Tombola. Unwanted fruit and vegetables were also continually donated to the Farm and will continue to do so even though the partnership has now ended.

Playgroup children, in November 2015, were looking at the topics of; people in communities, celebrating fireworks night and healthy eating.

During this time staff at New Ark took a number of playgroup children on a walk down to our local Sainsbury's. Whilst walking to the shop, staff gave children talks about the surrounding areas of our local community.

On arriving at Sainsbury's, members of staff from the shop gave a talk to the children about healthy eating. The children and staff of New Ark had the opportunity to go and hunt for healthy food around the store. The children then were able to go to the staff area of Sainsbury's and coloured in and made pictures of fireworks highlighting the rules





of safety around bonfire night.

During the partnership Sainsbury's contractor, Lynx Forecourt, who were doing update work on the garage forecourt also made a donation of £500 and provided workmen's safety helmets and fluorescent tabards for the children at New Ark.

In July as the community partnership come to an end, Sainsbury's handed a cheque of £3,065.29 to New Ark and with the donation from Lynx Forecourt of £500 it brought the amazing total figure of £3565.29. This money will be used to buy a trim trail for the adventure playground for the younger children to play on.

Eco Centre and Toddler Group Report

Eco Centre - We continue to run 4 sessions a week in the Eco-Centre and garden for our pre-school children in the Foundation Stage, i.e. the year before they start school. In the summer term we also run 2 more sessions for 12 younger children before they go into the bigger group. We are always excited about the progress that the children make through playing and working outdoors. By the time that they go to school, they are very confident, good at making decisions and able to assess risk.

At New Ark, we know that outdoor play is very important for all children; they need to experience the passing seasons and different weather conditions. They need to experience the four elements - earth, air, fire and water; our children especially appreciate earth and water - MUD!

In the Eco Garden they get to understand, from observation, life cycles of plants and small creatures. They are able to handle tadpoles and insects and watch bumble bees and beetles. The children enjoy working hard and they help us to look after the forest and garden. They like to dig and sweep and especially they like to shift woodchip in to the forest. At the same time, we are able to cover the whole early years curriculum outdoors, the children are learning and developing all of the time.

This year, as well are the usual summer sessions for the older children, in the Eco Garden, there have been sessions run by James and Nathan from Frog life. These were popular and we continue to benefit from the bug hotel that they built with the children.

The staff and children could not possibly manage all the maintenance tasks in the Eco Centre, garden and forest. We are very grateful for the help we get from work parties, to keep the premises and outside area safe and a pleasant place to be. This year, we have welcomed volunteers from Cummins, Yorkshire Building Society and Sainsbury's. We have had donations of plants from B+Q. A big thank you to all of them!

This has meant that workload for all staff has become greater and has put a strain on staff's time and resources, however the staff have stayed dedicated and have shown high standards of care for the children who attend New Ark.

With the dedication and hard work from the staff, the children have taken part in various activities to promote all areas of learning;

Prime areas—

- Personal, social and emotional development
- Communication and language
- Physical development

Throughout the year, the children and the staff of New Ark have taken part in many different events to help teach the children different skills and fill them with a rich experience of play. Also different events take place to help fundraise money which helps to keep New Ark going on a day to day basis.

The different events include;

Local Early Years - Training opportunities from the Early Years team are now limited due to costs except safe guarding and first aid. Play Support Services Report

We started the year with up to twenty five children on our register. We have seen another busy and eventful year. The outdoor curriculum remains beneficial for our children with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties. All children engage in tasks centred around our city farm which brings calmness and children feel safe to express their inner emotions during sessions. Responsibility plays an important role for our children, they are given many tasks to complete such as; cleaning out hutches, cleaning the pond or even collecting, testing and counting eggs which contributes towards positive outcomes for all children and even the animals.

Schools, Peterborough City Council, outside agencies and parents refer children to our facilities. Recently we have been quality assured by Cambridge City Council to use our facilities as an Alternative Education Provision.

We must never forget that children need to be given positive choices and often like adults, children encounter many different feelings and can also have their off days! Some children find it very difficult to express themselves and how they feel through words. I often refer to our brain and stomach as similar to the cycle of a washing machine with a mixture of negative feelings that get swirled around inside our bodies. The outcome for a child can mean that there is a sudden display of anger, destructive behaviour and they may of course verbally attack those that they see as threats or they may even become emotional and cry their eyes out. Our jobs within the support service is to offer the children an alternative curriculum, in order to build a trusting relationship, (after all why should I be any different and care?) Our children find the school environment difficult to access for many different reasons such as; its too overwhelming, the large classes, the feelings of anxiety, being away from a parent or possibly undiagnosed additional needs. Due to children encountering negative experiences they will often feel the same way they feel when in school when they first meet us. Time is spent learning more about each child through varied activities including verbal, creativity, observing and also importantly engaging with schools and parents. A timetable is planned around each child to ensure their likes and suggestions are incorporated. We mainly focus on the outdoors as our learning journey incorporates the farm and the adventure playground. It is important to remember that although children many not be in school full-time, they are still learning and building important positive life skills. What does the adventure playground teach? It helps to develop and encourage positive social skills, allows children to learn more about themselves by engaging in supervised low key risk taking and develops stronger gross motor skills.

At this time of the year, June and July, we say our goodbyes to some of our children who are moving on to new schools or purely increasing their timetable on their return after the summer holidays in September. This can be seen as a positive step for them, a deserving time for their hard work and determination that they have put into our programme.

A big thankyou goes out to all the staff that have worked hard over the last year and that have shown their support. Sam Brown


