New Ark Opening Times

Preschool Playgroup : Monday to Friday 09:00 - 12:00 12:30 - 15:00 (Term Time)

Eco Centre: 09:00 - 12:30 (Term Time)

Our children attending New Ark Playgroup learn through play using the Adventure Playground, City Farm and Eco Centre. Pre-school children use the Eco Centre as part of their full days in preparation for going to school. In the summer term we offer Eco sessions for children due to start pre-school in the September.

Toddler Group : Wednesday 13:00 - 15:00 (Term Time)

Our parent and toddler group are weekly sessions for children aged 0-4 years, giving them the time to explore our Eco Centre and City Farm with their family.

Play Support Service : 09:00 - 15:00 (Term Time)

In our Play Support Service we offer specialist support for individuals and small groups with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties. With our support, children can be helped with the transition back into a school setting.

Adventure Playground: 15:45 - 18:00 (Term Time) 08:30 - 17:30 (School Holidays)

During term time our After School Club is all about adventure play with activities such as digging, building, ball games, swinging and climbing; and other activities based around a range of creative arts and crafts. The children also have the opportunity to visit the farm. During the school holidays the children also get the opportunity to do baking in our kitchen, outdoor cooking, den building, water slides, messy play and more. During summer holidays we run Eco sessions and Forest School for under 8s.

(As a guide New Ark follows Newark Hill Academy's closure timetable)

City Farm : 10:00 - 12:00 15:45 - 17:30 (Open All Year)

During session time the children attending our Playgroup, Play Support Service, After School Club and Holiday Club get the opportunity to visit our City Farm and help to care for our animals. That includes grooming, feeding and cleaning out our small animal hutches. We also welcome group visits and visitors during term times and school holidays.

Preschool Report

As always we have had a really busy time in playgroup this year. We are extremely proud of how well our children coped with the disruption caused by COVID-19 and the changes we implemented to ensure that they could learn and play safely.

We've seen some changes in our team, and while we were sad to say goodbye to Nikki, Elisabeth, Jodie and Karen, we were delighted to welcome Chloe to our New Ark family, and also to welcome back Jayne.



We plan our activities and experiences around the children's interests and focus on providing opportunities for the children to be independent, such as learning to dress themselves for outdoor play. We also believe in providing a safe and supportive environment in which children can face challenges, as was highlighted in our recent Ofsted report;

'Children have excellent opportunities to be physically active and engage in risky play, which they learn to manage well. They climb, balance and swing with confidence on challenging physical play equipment, such as high balancing beams and bars.' Ofsted, 2020

We've made changes to our room and outdoor area, and introduced a rolling snack to the session to stop play from being interrupted. We often venture out into the community on walks and we took the children on regular trips to



Sainsburys where we bought ingredients to create delicious pizzas, cakes, biscuits that the children enjoyed making as much as eating!

We continue to provide our children with unique opportunities and experiences and love to use our wonderful Eco garden as an outdoor classroom to develop the children's understanding and appreciation of nature. This year the children grew their own vegetables which they then picked, cooked and ate, to help them understand where our food comes from. We have continued to focus on making learning fun, building children's confidence and supporting their social and emotional development through our carefully planned activities and daily routines.

'Staff are focused on developing children's language and communication skills. They engage children in conversation and sing songs every day. Children are interested in books and listen intently to stories.

Children show motivation and a willingness to learn. They approach activities with enthusiasm and welcome staff's quidance and



interaction in their play. Children are excited to visit the small farm on site and learn how to care for the animals there. They know to be gentle when they stroke and hold rabbits and guinea pigs.' Ofsted, 2020

We held our first Nativity Recital which was a very an enjoyable experience for all involved and we received lots of positive feedback from parents and carers.

Ofsted recognised the positive relationship we built with all of our parents and carers, who were regularly invited to come and share their child's time at preschool and look at their journals.

'Assessment is used effectively to help children make good progress, which is regularly shared with parents and they are encouraged to help further support children's learning at home. For example, parents participate in a book-lending scheme to encourage reading and promote speech. They attend regular stay-and-play sessions. Parents comment positively that staff are warm, caring and approachable.' Ofsted, 2020

A huge thank you to everyone who contributed to our fundraisers including photographs and a sponsored collect. All money raised was used to improve our outdoor area and replenish equipment.



Play Support Service Report

We have had another successful year in the Play Support Service that has been very rewarding for many children. We welcome children to our service that are experiencing social, emotional and behavioural difficulties and we find that they benefit greatly from our exceptional facilities and the childcentred approach to learning which is delivered by our skilled team.



Our alternative curriculum is based mainly on the outdoors which includes the farm, Eco garden and adventure playground. Children who attend participate in many different tasks and are given responsibility to help with the daily running of the farm. Children have the opportunity to engage with all of the animals; they help with

feeding, collecting eggs, cleaning out different animal enclosures and also learn how to carry out health checks on smaller animals. We have found that

being around animals is very therapeutic for the children, and helps to reduce their anxiety. They build a unique bond with the animals which boosts their emotional health. Their confidence flourishes by adapting to this different approach to learning and they often help with showcasing the different animals to the smaller children that visit from other schools.

Part of our curriculum also includes the Eco garden where children are



encouraged to explore and develop their understanding of our environment. They become immersed in the world of nature, enjoying activities such as finding different bugs and naming them, leaf printing and pond dipping. Our Eco garden is a calming tranquil area where children are able to seek relaxation and listen to the soothing sounds of the swaying trees above. Throughout the year we have been promoting different festivals and children have been creative in making cards, gifts and posters. One of the festivals we have learnt about was the Chinese New Year which included learning about the Chinese Horoscope, and children enjoyed taking part in some food tasting.



We have also been learning about online safety with children creating posters to promote safe use of the internet.

Understanding the British Values and promoting these through our activities have played an important role throughout our everyday learning. As part of this we encourage children to contribute towards planning rules for both the farm, for when they are working together and for the activities they do in the garden.

Every child matters at New Ark and we value their contribution by encouraging their input in putting ideas forward during sessions. It is important that children are listened to, given responsibility and feel valued.

We have a great team to support all children and I thank you all for your hard work and commitment to making a difference to the lives of some of our most complex and hard to reach children.

favourite with children, but is also enjoyed by young people and adults who attend our **social mornings** and **animal care courses**, as well as those who volunteer and complete animal care placements and enrichment activities such as **Princes Trust** and **Duke of Edinburgh Awards**.

We were very pleased to be able to continue our partnership

with City College, offering animal care courses to students from their John Mansfield Campus. The farm provides a welcoming, inclusive and supportive environment which appeals to people of all abilities, and we've had very positive feedback from all of the learners who have completed our animal care courses.

We are hoping to make some much needed improvements to the farm in the coming months, thanks to generous donations from the Alan Boswell Group and Perkins, which we're hoping to use to replace our dilapidated hay shed and replenish the gravel across the farm.

For a small daily fee of £1.50 per night, New Ark can board your animals with us while you are away on holiday. We can care for guinea pigs, rabbits and chickens.





Farm Volunteer Stories

The Farm benefits hugely from the support of a dedicated group of volunteers, some of whom have shared their stories below as they wanted to share how much New Ark Farm means to them.

Originally I started volunteering at the city farm, along with my daughter who has a learning disability, in October 2019. In those first months both adults and children mixed in together looking after and caring not just for the animals but, for one another too.

However as we know, during March 2020 we unfortunately had to close the farm due to the pandemic to all but a few volunteers who didn't have to shield. This worked well, as we



had a rota going, meaning the hours we spent at the farm were with the same group.

During March I also got my husband involved and we have found the farm as a family to be not only good exercise, but also to be stress relieving. It can give you a real sense of satisfaction watching the various animals enjoy their surroundings, knowing that you have helped create it. We all pool our thoughts on situations that arise, to find a solution. Being here has been a real bonus to our mental health during these tough few months. We work quite hard, having a giggle on the way.

Hi, my name is Natalie. I came to the farm more than five years ago, with my support worker at the time, Glynis. This lady supported me whilst I was very unwell. Through coming to the farm I came to know a few good people, Carolyn included, they made me feel very welcome and all were very kind to me.

A few years later, I left the farm to embark upon various other things, mainly more voluntary work, for example gardening at the local orchard; which I found very beneficial and welcoming, like the farm, although I found myself feeling much more at home at the farm than I did working elsewhere.

There is always things to do and there is never a dull moment, everyone is friendly and it is always a nice place to be, even just simply to relax and be with the animals. I love working at the farm and I will always remember the hospitality given and the friendship I have gained.

Treasurer's Report

We started the year in April 2019 on a positive note by opening our doors for our very popular Easter Egg Hunt event, which saw many parents and children visit, raising over £2,000. Fundraising is a key activity for us as the money that we receive through grants, government funding and fees unfortunately does not cover all of our overheads throughout the year.

Throughout 2019/2020 our staff and volunteers worked hard to fundraise by donating their time; and parents and businesses donated goods to sell or raffle at our Summer Festival, which raised £1,800 and our Christmas Bazaar, which raised £800. This was closely followed by Carolyn's Christmas Lights Switch On in Bishop's Close, which raised £400.





We have previously needed to raise around £15,000 each year but this figure increases from April 2020 as our funding has been reduced by the Local Council, and this funding will soon stop completely.

Due to having to close for a period of time due to COVID-19 restrictions, our Accounts have not yet been finalised so I do not have any definite figures yet, but I am very optimistic that we have made a small profit.

This would be a great outcome considering the immense challenges of the past seven months, and is only possible from the great work that the staff, volunteers, parents and the rest of our Committee do for us; so thank you all.

The coming year may be tough with ongoing COVID-19 issues and lack of Council funding but we will strive to do our best for all involved.
