# Opening Times

## **Toddler Group :** Wednesday 1pm—2.30pm (Term Time)

Our weekly toddler group is for children aged 0-4 years and their parents / carers, and provides an opportunity to explore our Eco Centre and City Farm.

## **Preschool :** Monday to Friday 9am—12pm and 12:30pm—3pm (Term Time)

We offer morning, afternoon and all day sessions for children from age 2 years, plus extended hours by arrangement. Our children attending New Ark Preschool learn through play using our fantastic facilities, which includes an Adventure Playground, City Farm and Eco Centre.

## **Play Support Service :** Monday to Friday 9am—3pm (Term Time)

In our Play Support Service we accept referrals from primary and secondary schools to provide specialist support and an alternative outdoor curriculum for children with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties who are on a reduced timetable and/or at risk of exclusion from school.

## **After-school Club :** Monday to Friday 3.45—6pm (Term Time)

## **Holiday Club** 8:30am—5:30pm (School Holidays)

Our After School Club is all about adventure play with activities such as digging, building, ball games, swinging and climbing; and a range of creative arts and crafts. The children also have the opportunity to visit the farm.

The children at our Holiday Club also have the opportunity to do baking, outdoor cooking, den building, water slides, messy play and more.

Our Holiday Club includes the Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme, which provides free supervised play sessions and a hot lunch for children from low income families. (As a guide New Ark follows Newark Hill Academy's term timetable)

## **City Farm :** Monday to Friday group visits by arrangement 10am—12pm and 2pm—4pm

Open for public visits Monday to Friday 4pm—5pm. (Term Time) and 10am—12pm and 2pm—5pm (School Holidays)

## **Adult social mornings** Wednesdays 10am-12pm

During session times the children attending our Toddler Group, Preschool, Play Support Service, After School Club and Holiday Club can visit our City Farm and help to care for our animals. This includes feeding, watering, grooming, and cleaning out our small animal hutches. We also welcome family and group visits and visitors during term times and school holidays. Adults of any age and ability are welcome at our adult social mornings.

# Playground Report

Hello, and thank you for taking the time to read our annual report. I'd love to introduce myself, share a little about our unique provision here at New Ark, and warmly invite you to come and visit us.

My name is Samantha Brown and I've had the privilege of working at New Ark for over 24 years. During that time I have been very lucky to work amongst amazing and dedicated people who are passionate about New Ark and providing quality care to the children, young people and adults who use our services.

Our Holiday Club and Afterschool Club offer vibrant, inclusive sessions for school-aged children. Each day is shaped by the children themselves - we listen closely to their ideas and interests, and use them to guide our planning. Their creativity and curiosity are at the heart of everything we do.

We believe play is a vital part of every child's learning and development. That's why we offer a wide range of indoor and outdoor activities, and encourage children to make their own choices. Whether they're exploring, creating, relaxing or adventuring, we're here to support them in discovering what brings them joy.

Over the past year, some of the most popular activities have included jewellery-making, painting, junk-modelling, caring for our animals on the City Farm, and sliding down the water slide on hot summer days. The farm, in particular, has been a favourite - children love feeding and grooming the animals, topping up water bottles and cleaning out hutches. They've even learned how to carry out health checks on our smaller residents, inspecting teeth, eyes and paws with care and confidence.

One memorable moment from our Afterschool Club involved a child who used her imagination to create homemade "squishies" out of paper. She designed and coloured her own characters, cut them out, and taped them together - leaving a small gap to stuff with shredded paper before sealing them up. She then helped other children make their own, sharing her technique and encouraging their creativity.

During the summer holidays, cooking and tasting sessions were a big hit. Children tried lots of new flavours, including experimenting with spices, and learned practical kitchen skills - all while having fun and building confidence.



One of the greatest joys of working at New Ark is watching children grow - seeing their independence blossom, their confidence soar, and their friendships deepen. Over the years, many former attendees have returned as parents, bringing their own children to experience the magic of New Ark. Hearing their stories and memories is always a heartwarming reminder of the lasting impact that New Ark creates.

If you haven't visited us yet, we'd love to welcome you. Come and see the joy, creativity and care that make New Ark such a special place.

### **HAF (Holiday Activities and Food) Programme**

We're proud to have continued delivering the Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme throughout the Easter, Summer and Christmas school holidays - welcoming many new children from across the city into our New Ark family.

Funded by the Department for Education, the HAF Programme supports families in receipt of benefit-related free school meals. Eligible children can attend for up to four days a week, enjoying four hours of enriching activities each day. Alongside a wide variety of fun, creative and inclusive experiences, we also provide nutritious hot and cold meals to keep children energised and well-fed.

From imaginative play to outdoor adventures, every session is designed to spark joy, build confidence and create lasting memories.

# Preschool Report

New Ark Preschool is unique as it's the only preschool in the city where children regularly visit a city farm as well as having the opportunity to participate in onsite Eco sessions.



This year at New Ark Pre-School, we enjoyed a rich programme of seasonal activities that supported learning, exploration, and development in all areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

We embraced all four seasons through creative craft projects, nature-based learning, and outdoor experiences. For example, during Autumn the children enjoyed going on nature walks to the Eco Garden; where they observed the changing colours of the trees throughout the year.

A highlight of the year was an exciting visit from several fire engines, following their rescue of a pig at the farm! The children were delighted to see the flashing lights and hear the sirens up close!

Throughout the year, we marked special occasions and cultural celebrations, including Chinese New Year and Pancake Day, which provided opportunities for sensory exploration, food-tasting and learning about different traditions.

In May, we welcomed the 'Up The Garden Bath' charity to our setting. Their team led a bug hunt and helped the children plant a range of flowers and vegetables in the Eco Garden, teaching them about nature, sustainability, and healthy eating.



One of the most magical experiences was watching our caterpillars grow into butterflies. The children observed every stage of the life cycle, learning about transformation and the natural world, before releasing the butterflies into the garden.

The academic year also saw a record high number of children with special educational needs, and we are proud to report that all were successfully supported through to school transition, each with their Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) journey underway. Whilst this stretched our staff to the limits, it demonstrates the dedication and commitment our staff have to early intervention and inclusive practice.

*'Children are confident, articulate and friendly. They enjoy participating in a wide range of activities available to them at this unique provision. For example, they learn about animal care at the on-site farm, on play equipment in the extensive outdoor area. Parents also appreciate how much these activities benefit all aspects of their children's development.'*

# Farm Report

Our city farm is home to Cheddar the pig and Cyrano the pony as well as lots of birds and small animals. It is a wonderfully friendly and therapeutic safe haven, where children, young people and adults of all ages and abilities can spend quality time.

We have welcomed lots of visitors to our farm this year from local nurseries and primary, secondary and special schools, including Woodfield playgroup, Daisy Chain nursery, Thomas Moore and St John Fisher. We have also worked closely with In-To-To-Ed and Nene Park Hub delivering animal care sessions.

Our birthday parties have proven to be very popular again this year and have raised valuable funds for the farm.

In addition to the support provided by our regular volunteers we have been hugely grateful for the brilliant work undertaken by fabulous work parties from Welcome Break, MH Accountants, Virgin Media, Mastercard, Peterborough City Council Statutory Assessment and Monitoring Team.

We continue to be immensely grateful for the invaluable ongoing weekly support from the local Probation Community Payback team. In addition to working hard on the farm, painting and gardening and general maintenance, they helped put a new roof on our pig house and have built a variety of things from scratch; including benches, planting workstations and some

## Introducing Masha - our trainee vet volunteer

I was so relieved when I found the city farm at New Ark as I'd been searching for veterinary work experience for over six months. New Ark is a wonderful place, where there is such a huge variety of animals tucked away in this little farm, in the heart of the city that I'd never even heard about before.



When I first arrived at the start of the summer holidays I was welcomed by the entire New Ark community and was given the opportunity to get hands on experience of animal husbandry in the real world - for example, how to pick up chickens, motivate Cheddar the pig to be more active, and build up resistance to the smell of a chicken coop! Equally, there were many heartwarming moments like watching young chickens huddle together, learning how to make Cyrano the pony smile and hearing the joyous squeaks of guinea pigs as they look forward to eating their greens!

As New Ark is a charity I think one of the most important things I have learnt through my time here - aside from the fact that the guinea pigs are absolutely adorable - is that there is always something you can do to help it to move forward. Someone who helped me find New Ark - and regularly helps out alongside me is my lovely mother Natalia.



## New Ark Social Community Hub

In addition to providing animal care, we have become a social prescribing venue/hub. We work closely with local organisations and groups who promote wellbeing and positive mental health, and provide support to adults with a range of neurodiversity and additional needs.

The sessions we provide have proved very popular and our visitors, who have a variety of different abilities, all enjoy both the social side (having a cup of tea with friends) as well as the opportunity to interact with our animals, which is great for building their confidence and self-esteem and enabling them to feel valued.

Our animals play a vital role in our provision of therapeutic support to improve individuals' wellbeing and we look forward to continuing to provide our unique service to our community for many years to come.

As with previous years I would like to say a massive thank you to all of our fantastic volunteers who selflessly give their time to support our farm. Their hard work, sponsorship and donations allow us to continue providing a home for all of our animals in our care and a place to be enjoyed by so many.



We were very lucky to be chosen to by Gladwells Pet and Country Store to benefit from their Christmas fundraising campaign last December. They really enjoyed meeting our animals when they visited the farm to present a cheque and we hugely appreciated the generosity of their customers.

He has also undertaken repairs and maintenance across the whole site which has been invaluable for the upkeep of New Ark and we are hugely grateful for his time and expertise.

# Play Support Service Report

New Ark's Play Support Service is a unique provision which provides support to children who are experiencing social, emotional, and behavioural difficulties, and are at risk of exclusion from school.

Our nurturing and therapeutic approach is provided in New Ark's unique setting, which includes an Eco Forest/Garden, City Farm and Adventure Playground. These resources give us many great opportunities to support children in the development of their life skills. Particular emphasis is placed upon social, emotional development and communication skills. Our planned outcomes are to see happy children, accessing appropriate education and reaching their full potential.

We have built lasting and trusting relationships with local schools who refer children to work with us because of our track record of delivering positive outcomes.

## Livija's story

Livija joined us when she was 8 in May 2023. Initially understandably anxious, Liv was supported by a school staff member, however, with reassurance, support and encouragement she soon settled in and was able to confidently manage her sessions unsupported. Her progress meant that soon after this we were also able to extend the duration of Liv's sessions.



Livija thrived in our supportive and relaxed sessions, particularly enjoying art and construction activities in our Cabin and chicken feeding and hosing on the Farm (which she still finds therapeutic). Throughout her time with us Liv's confidence and social skills have developed immensely and we have developed a great relationship with her, enjoying her amazing knowledge and sense of humour.

In 2024 we trialled taking Liv to help out in our Playgroup sessions and this has been a massive success! She is fantastic with the younger children who clearly adore her and look forward to Liv's visits, the arrangement benefitting all concerned.

Liv continues to thrive, pushing herself more to try new experiences, showing greater tolerance and generosity towards others' needs and developing the ability to positively manage her feelings and behaviour. Feedback from her school is really positive, telling us that 'Livija has made excellent progress' and that they 'have seen a positive impact in school'.

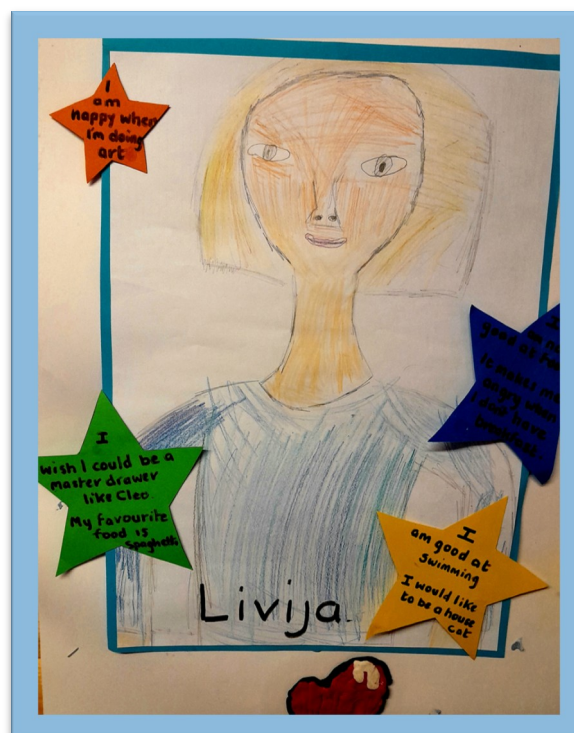

## Raihan's story

I am Raihan, known as Ray by my colleagues, and for the past year, I have been undertaking an apprenticeship at New Ark.

In addition to completing finance and administration work in the office at New Ark, I attend Peterborough College to complete the academic element of my apprenticeship.

I have gained a lot of valuable experience while working at New Ark, including improving my written communication and IT skills, I am also developing essential knowledge and skills which will support my future ambition of becoming an accountant. This includes invoicing and basic book-keeping using Xero accounting software.

An important part of working for a charity involves seeking ways to be cost-effective and fundraising, and I have been keen to make a positive difference at New Ark while working here. I arranged an upgrade of New Ark's telephone system while simultaneously reducing the cost of our monthly bills in this area. I have liaised with local businesses to source donated items to raffle at our fetes and I also applied for funding from Waitrose Community Matters fund and was very proud when I successfully secured a donation of £1,000.

We were also given the opportunity to hire two skips for free to support our own recycling efforts!
